On WebAdvisor there are 3 term blocks:

**When searching for courses on Webadvisor:**

- **Specify “Summer 2022” for SUPV522 (CPC) and SUPV532 (CPE) only.**
- **All other intensive courses are listed under “Summer 2022 Block 1” and “Summer 2022 Block 2”.**
- Block 1 includes courses in May and June
- Block 2 includes courses in July and August
- Remember to double-check course number, course name, and instructor to make sure you are pulling up the right course.
- Make sure you don't accidentally sign up for a course in the Latinx MTS program (in Spanish), the Openseminary MPT program, or the Openseminary MDiv program because the course titles are similar. It is best to double-check the name of the instructor.

## Course Descriptions and Details

<p><b>All Summer</b></p>	<p><b>SUPV-522 Clinical Pastoral Care</b>  3 credits • Prerequisites: SFRM-505, PRMN-510, either THLE-520 or THLE-521, and a minimum of 30 earned credits  Supervised Ministries Department</p> <p>Pastoral visitation in a hospital or other institutional setting under clinical supervision. Verbatim reports, reading critiques, supervision, peer discussion and in-service learning experiences are included in the program. At least 160 hours of supervised learning is required. Offered during summer, fall, and spring.</p>
<p><b>All Summer</b></p>	<p><b>SUPV-532 Clinical Pastoral Education</b>  3 or 6 credits • Prerequisites: SFRM-505, PRMN-510, either THLE-520 or THLE-521, and a minimum of 30 earned credits  Supervised Ministries Department</p> <p>A basic CPE unit of supervised clinical pastoral education in certified CPE centers. The program includes verbatim writing, lectures, visitations, on-call involvement, peer process group, individual supervision and in-service learning experiences. At least 400 hours of supervised learning is required. Offered 12 weeks in the summer or as an extended experience throughout the academic year. Supervised Ministries Department and institutional chaplain.  <i>May be substituted for SUPV-522 CPC</i></p>
<p><b>May 16 – June 3</b>  Monday–Friday  8:30 am–12:00 pm  In person at Narberth Presbyterian Church</p> <p>No meeting on Memorial Day, May 30</p>	<p><b>BIBL-516 New Testament Greek</b>  3 credits • No prerequisite  Dr. Deborah Watson</p> <p>A beginner’s course in the language of the New Testament covering the basic elements of grammar. Students are introduced to elementary readings in the New Testament. <i>Students must have e-mail access and mastery of New Testament Greek alphabet by first class meeting.</i>  <a href="#">Students who have taken Greek in college may want to test out of this course.</a></p>
<p><b>June 13 – June 17</b>  Monday–Friday  8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.</p>	<p><b>THLE-623 Christian Social Ethics</b>  3 credits • No prerequisite  Dr. Tokunbo Adelekan</p> <p>An introduction to ethical discourse, this class will survey the field of theological ethics so that Christians may engage the ethical issues of the common life, shape the institutions of society, and aid persons in forming faithful and objective moral judgments about public matters. Special attention will be given to the relationship between Christian faith and economics, politics and law. A sub-theme will be ecclesiology, a critical examination of the mission and purpose of the Church.</p>

<p><b>June 20 – June 24</b> Monday–Friday 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.</p>	<p><b>PRMN-635C Preaching the Social Gospel</b> 3 credits • No prerequisite Dr. Rodney Kennedy</p> <p>The African American prophetic tradition has been the conscience of America. This course investigates the social gospel as preached by Martin Luther King, Jr., James Forbes, and Otis Moss III with introduction to the writings of James Cone and Cornell West. The father of the social gospel movement, the Baptist Walter Rauschenbusch, will be studied. Students will have the opportunity to preach the gospel in its social implications. Here is the gospel with sizzle, passion, and compassion for the "least of these."</p>
<p><b>July 5 – August 12</b> Asynchronous online for the first 4 weeks, and required synchronous Zoom meetings on August 2, 4, 9, &amp; 11 from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m.</p>	<p><b>PRMN-611 Coaching Skills for Today's Leaders</b> 3 credits • No prerequisite Dr. Deborah Winters</p> <p>This course will equip students with basic coaching skills that can be integrated and incorporated into their ministry setting. Coach training can dramatically enhance the ministry leader's effectiveness as a leader and greatly increase the impact within their faith community and the larger local community.</p>
<p><b>July 25 – July 29</b> Monday–Friday 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.</p>	<p><b>CHHM-621 Christus Victor and Spiritual Warfare</b> 3 credits • Prerequisites: CHHM-510, and BIBL-501 or BIBL-503 Dr. George Hancock-Stefan</p> <p>What is spiritual warfare? Does it happen in far-off jungles, urban centers, or suburbia? Is there a possibility that we have domesticated the work of the Devil in our society? Commonly speaking, people consider exorcisms, witch doctors, and casting spells as evidence of spiritual warfare. But there are far more arenas in our Christian life in which the Devil is trying to find a foothold. This course is intentionally called "Christus Victor" because we believe that Jesus triumphed over the Devil on the cross and that he wants us to live in the freedom that comes from that triumph. In this course we will examine the concept of spiritual warfare in both expected and unexpected venues.</p>
